Minutes of Friends meeting of September 12, 2023 approved, as in the Newsletter, without comment. Treasurer's Report: for September & October by Sue Johnson in Gwen Kuehn's absence. Balance of \$5,450.42. Report accepted subject to audit.

Membership/Newsletter: Jeanette Mateer commented on renewal of annual membership and gifts during September and October.

Director's Report: Brice Bush updated Friends on library maintenance projects. She is continuing her review of non-fiction shelf titles, assessing usage and condition.

She also examines donations for those in good condition and potential appeal which could be added to the circulating collections. Other donations are passed along to the Book Nook for resale.

She commented on the strength of the staff and their support and cooperation as she becomes more familiar with the operation of the CAPL.

Program Director's Report: Paula commented on the number and diversity of CAPL activities in recent

and coming months. She shared handouts describing many of these programs, classes and children's events.

Library staff are looking forward to a repeat of last year's livereindeer visit. This program is coordinated with a gift of reading event, staffed by Friends' volunteers, with a free book for each child.

Other seasonal events: making gingerbread houses, a gift tag workshop, and a 'make & take' ornament workshop. During the winter holiday break, CAPL will host several movies. Old Business: Discussion of need to review soft and hard cover books in hand prior to the Gift of Reading event coordinated with the reindeer visit to assure enough books for variety of ages are available.

New Business: Sue Johnson announced that Mary Ellen Sheridan

agreed to serve as the Friends of CAPL Secretary.

Jeanette made a motion to provide \$400 for a Librarian's Discretionary Fund to support specials projects needs for CAPL. Motion was supported by Mary Ellen. Motion passed.

Mary Ellen moved to adjourn the meeting at 1:30 with support from Sue.

On Wednesday, April 10th at 6:00 pm, in collaboration with the Straits Area Audubon Society, we welcome U.S. Forest Service Insect Specialist, Robert Haaks. His presentation, "Aquatic Insects, Concentrating on the Value of Midges to Migrating Birds," will cover information relating to many groups of aquatic insects and interesting aspects of their life histories.

Did you know hatching aquatic midges serve as the primary food source for birds and fish? Join us to discover more interesting facts about aquatic insects and learn the important roles they play in keeping freshwater ecosystems functioning properly.

Join us to meet accomplished author and English Professor Emeritus from Northern Michigan University, John Smolens, as part of the Library of Michigan's 2024 Michigan Notable Books Author Tour.

Smolens' latest novel, A Cold, Hard Prayer, is a work of historical fiction and his 12th novel. Smolens previously made the MI Notable Book list for Wolf's Mouth in 2017 and Day of Days in 2022. Refreshments will be served at this event, all are welcome to attend.

The Michigan Notable Books (MNB) program is designed to promote reading of Michigan authors and stories by annually selecting twenty titles that best reflect the diverse ethnic, historical, literary, and cultural experiences in the state Each MNB selection offers a unique touch point into the rich stories and beautiful landscape of our great state.

In addition, the Library of Michigan Foundation is hosting the Night for Notables reception on Saturday, April 20th to honor the 2024 Michigan Notable Books authors. Stephen Mack Jones, the two-time Michigan Notable Books award winning author of *August Snow* and *Dead of Winter* will give a keynote and attendees will get a chance to meet many of the 2024 Notable authors. The Michigan Seed Library Network One Seed featured seed for 2024 is the "Mammoth Long Island Dill." Thanks to our helpful volunteer Deb Weisberger these special edition dill seeds have been recently added to our Seed Library.

This heirloom variety of an essential herb for cooking, preserving and healing is easy to grow. Dill may be used at any age: microgreens, young leaves, flower heads, seeds and is great for container growing and companion planting.

This variety of dill which attracts

pollinators, will stand 24"-48" tall and is often a host plant for Swallowtail Butterfly caterpillars. Seed heads form in seventy plus days.

Michigan is the number one pickling cucumber producer in the United States with 35,000 acres in production. Dill is an integral part of creating the finished product.

A seed library is a community-oriented project that allows participants to share seeds with one another by "checking out" seed packets of their choosing.


A wide variety of flower, herb, fruit and vegetable seeds are available for anyone interested to take home and plant.

The "borrowing" of seeds is open to anyone and you do not need a library card to take seeds out or to bring in seeds to share. The Seed Library operates on the honor system.

We encourage members to learn basic seed-saving techniques. If you are unable to save your own seeds, please consider donating a packet or two of fresh, commercially grown, open-pollinated seeds to keep our Seed Library stocked.

Please drop off any seed donations to the front desk. A special thank you to Harvest Thyme Farm for donating seeds to our Seed Library!
