

## Friends Meeting Sept 12

Minutes of the June 13, 2023 meeting were approved as written in the newsletter, with the correction of Brice's starting day at the library.

Treasurers Report: Gwen discussed Book Nook receipts, comparing to recent winter months, as part of discussion whether Book Nook should close during January & February. Sue & Jeanette are willing to work those months.

Jeanette did not have a membership count; newsletter will go out prior to each meeting.

**Directors report**: Brice reported she is still getting acquainted with library staff, building and procedures. She is looking forward to working at CAPL.

Program Directors report: Paula: Coming programs. September 6 author visit canceled. Blood drive, teen book club & Audubon meeting featuring "Bumblebeez" in September. September and October: Scarecrow Stroll in town and a Halloween parade, both with staff participation.

October 4, a husband and wife team will discuss mission boat show *Malacca Mac* profiling culture & hardware of the time. October 12, Melissa Kalin will present book *Below the 45th Parallel*, about the aurora borealis in our northern skies. She's quite knowledgeable.

Abbi and Nancy are working on a haunted house in the gallery open for children the last few days of October, similar to the Funhouse and candy land house available for children in early summer.

October 24, "the Lord of the Gourd" will have a demonstration of carving on the main floor of the library between 5 and 8 PM.

Downtown trick-or-treating on October 31 with the friends and again distributing free books to children.

The reindeer will be at the library on Sunday, December 3 from 2 to 4 PM; the friends will be distributing a free book to each child. This replaces the Santa visit we've held for many years. The Parade of Lights is Saturday, December 2, from 2 to 6 PM and friends are invited to join the staff marching in the parade.

**Old business:** Sue discussed Family Fun day at the fair; over 200 books were distributed to children. Jeanette mentioned fair organizers were more

cooperative this year, making it easier for those of us displaying materials.

New business: Discussed the Gift of Reading, October 31 and requested Paula ask for the same location as last year. A motion was made to authorize Gwen to spend up to \$1,000 to purchase books for our Gift of Reading; particularly board books & early readers. Will also look through Book Nook to see if some should be offered as Gift of Reading giveaways.

Secretary nominations: As Jeanette is now a member of the board and unable to hold an office in the friends, a replacement secretary is needed. Jeanette will include a request in the information sent out with Paula's next column to all members who have emails. Jeanette made a motion to provide \$1200 for the teen take and read program Rosita supported. She also made a motion to donate \$800 to the library to fund the reindeer visit on December 2, with Pat Hubbard supporting.


