Gwen reported revenue was up from years closed because of Covid. Mary Ellen had a record day of \$163.00 last Sat.

Directors Report

Mark reported a replacement, Brice Bush, most recently from East Lansing, has been hired to begin work on July 1.

The central vacuum system has been repaired and new boiler installed to heat the sidewalks.

The Board passed the new budget with property value increased by \$60 K.

Hoopla use had greatly increased. Four bikes were donated to the Lib rary of Things.

The culling of books not checked out for ten years or more is continuing.

Finally, three employees were recognized for 20 years of service and Mark has 21 years and Paula has 26 years.

Rivertown Patchworkers welcomes anyone interested in quilting to a fun get together on Tuesday, September 26th from 6:00-7:30 p.m. at the library.


